## **Global Anglicanism**

### **Course Description:**

A survey of the history of member churches of the Anglican Communion and Anglicans from other jurisdictions in the non-Western world, with opportunity for extended focus on particular geographic regions, groups, or themes. --from the TSM *Academic Catalog*.

This course provides a biblical theological foundation for the history and current practice of member churches of the Anglican Communion, with attention to non-Western settings, and opportunity for in-depth focus on specific regions, ethnic groups, or issues. The course uses a seminar approach to the study of the global expansion of a state church to a global communion. The missional hermeneutic of the bible, rather than the biblical basis of missions, supplies a framework to deepen this inquiry and discern points of application to mission and ministry for global Anglicanism today.

The course will also take advantage of the Professor's extensive experience traveling and working in many locations in the Anglican Communion.

### **Goals:**

1. To appreciate the missional hermeneutic of the Bible as foundational for Global Anglicanism, a movement from the Church of England starting in the 18<sup>th</sup> century.
2. To consider indigenous Anglican movements in non-Western locations, particularly where these have contributed to the development of global Anglicanism, within the missional hermeneutic of the Bible and the context of global Christianity.
3. To assess our mission and ministry as Global Anglicans both today and for the future in light of our past history and the missional hermeneutic of the Bible

## Course Requirements:

**(1) Completion of weekly reading assignments and participation in discussion boards, online group forums at times convenient to the class participants, or the occasional quiz based on the reading (40% of grade).**

**(3) Final projects (30% of grade):**

Select one topic from the following four, then research and write a **12 page paper** (excluding bibliography) that reflects a missional hermeneutic of the Bible and indigenizing/ pilgrim principles in relation to cultural, missiological, and historical issues:

- research evangelism and church planting movements amongst unreached people groups from a non-western part of the Anglican Communion: interview diocesan, provincial personnel, use multiple data sources such as Joshua Project, World Christian Database, ethnographic resources, etc; assess within a missional hermeneutic;
- investigate a part of the Anglican Communion outside of the western world: you can focus on a specific event, person or movement;
- research Anglican engagement with an indigenous ethnic minority or first nation people within the western world;
- complete an extensive bibliographic study on Global Anglicanism: you can focus on unpublished dissertations of non-western Anglicanism, relevant articles, journals and books not available in Trinity's library, etc.

You are free to suggest an alternative paper/project that does not appear on the above list, **but you still must have the approval of the professor.** Completed final projects will be due by **December 19, 2017.** Late projects will be penalized 5% per day.
